## Non-Fiction File Folder Rubric

Once you have completed all of your research, you and your partner need to create a file folder presentation of some kind. Illustrations need to be hand-drawn and colorful. The overall appearance of the file folder should be magazine-like.

The content of your folder is mostly up to you and your partner. What do you think is important for people to know about this event? What happened during this event? What was the cause? Make sure you include a brief summary of the event so that someone reading your folder would have a general knowledge of what took place. Also, you need to include an explanation of how the crowd turned into a mob during this particular event. What were the consequences? Did participants act rationally? See the rubric below for more detailed criteria.
